With all of the past sins of the church being exposed (as with the residential schools), we do have to humble ourselves by praying and turning from our wicked ways for healing to come (II Chron 7:14). Yes, we need to acknowledge our past but as I Cor 6:11 says "Some of you

were once like that. But you were cleansed: you were made holy; you were made right with God by calling on the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God" (NLT).

We are blessed to live in Canada. We are blessed by the good things of the past.

So let us Celebrate God's goodness in the midst of the horribleness of sin, and pray that "He shall have dominion also from sea to sea".




Celebrating Eternal Life in the midst of Physical Death

"Just a note to inform you of my husband's passing on May 4 following a major stroke on April 17th. He was just 6 weeks short of his 90th birthday on June 20.

Celebrating assistance provided after the death of a loved one.

We have mourned, yet rejoiced in the celebration of those **POWER Team** members who have entered their eternal home. In two previous issues of **CONNECTOR**, Jeannette Bucek celebrated the work husband Gord had done in leaving her great information as to the practical things one needs to deal with the issues of one's death.

In our 50th issue of **CONNECTOR** we announced the death of Laurie McLean. As wife Nancy discovered, there are lots of things to care for after a death and many forms to fill out. Nancy has passed on to us some great assistance she received from a company called Peacehold Estate Documentation. "Peacehold provides executor assistance to help simplify a complex process and speed your time to claim and closure".

The information here is by no means "approved" by the C&MA in Canada or **POWER Team** leadership. We are just passing this along to you, with a testimony of what they did for Nancy McLean after the death of Laurie in April.

Nancy said: "After you contact them for help they arrange a phone call with you in order that you can supply them with the necessary details - like numbers from health card, driver's license, S.I.N., tax credit details like pensions etc. They already know of all the govt. departments that need notification of the death but you can also add any other groups that need this information like insurance companies or memberships, or credit cards or whoever you need to inform.



They then prepare a personalized folder for you which you receive in the mail in about 2 weeks. Inside the folder are individual forms for each department or company. There are the official govt. forms which they have already filled in for you - all you do is add your signature. There is a covering letter which you also just sign. Then they tell you which documents to include in each envelope that is already stamped ready to send. They explain if the documents for each envelope need to be the original, a certified copy, a photocopy or whatever.

Some govt. forms say this too but not as clearly as this company does it.

For many envelopes you need a certified death certificate (available from the funeral home) and the Will (available from your lawyer).

It relieved all the stress of trying to get the govt. forms during covid and trying to understand how to fill them out! They speed up the time for your claims and benefits.

All I had to do was sign my name on various forms and letters, do some photocopying and fill the envelopes with the required documents. In one afternoon, it was all done and sent off. For every letter and form sent, they have prepared a photocopy for your own records too.

I do not have any regrets using this company - extremely accurate and professional.

New DS for Canadian Pacific District – Mark Peters who has served at North Shore Alliance in Vancouver. We look forward to his support of our **POWER Team** ministry.



book called Quotes, Jokes and Andecdotes. Besides the joy of the Lord being our strength, it is always good to tell our face to smile.


Strawberries came early in June in Ontario this year. Here was one helpful suggestion from a friend.
