**3. You have the gift of creativity**, incredible talent in art, design, style, cooking ... everything that is handmade. You are thoughtful and giving of your time, making your crafts and giving them away (we kids have always said if you would sell your paintings, your dolls, etc, well, we'd be rich by now!).

**4.** You are a woman who believes in tradition, and in the values of family. Your family comes first. Like papa, you have shown throughout our lives that we - my siblings and I, the grandchildren - matter most. You are the glue that keeps us together, connected, while thousands of miles apart.

**5. You love my father** with the heart of a strong and gracious woman, and hold him so high. What a role model the two of you have been in your marriage, your friendship, your love and commitment, one to and for the other.

**6. I inherited my thrill of adventure**, my "daredevil" tendency, the adrenaline junkie ... from bungeejumping to skydiving, having the heavy foot on the "go" and sometimes a little impatient, with a "let's get on with it" attitude. All from you! ...and I love that I have this intense curiosity and adventuresome streak.

**7.** I have also inherited some of the more complex and complicated traits - the overthinking, the worrying, the insomnia, the doubting, the second guessing, the challenged listening ... all seemingly less desirable, but not so! Norma and I pastored the Oakville and Poplar Point Alliance churches (a two- point charge) from 1997 to 2005. The Oakville church closed in 1999, and the Poplar Point church closed in 2005.

Following the closing of the Poplar Point church, Norma and I returned to Regina, Norma's home town, to help care for her aging parents. I got a job at the RCMP training Academy, working in the Custodial Services unit, where I continue to work. I have had the honour of doing a bit of chaplaincy work there. I was also able to serve local churches doing pulpit supply.

That came to an end when Norma's rapidly progressing dementia robbed her of her music, and required my full attention. Early in 2018, the moment I had been dreading

came, and I had to place Norma in a long-term care facility, where she has been since. I believe that God gave me an incredible honour in being her caregiver. When he brought us together 36 years ago, He knew what would be now, and yet He entrusted her to my care. May I not fail Him or her.

I have been blessed during the pandemic to know that my wife has been well cared for. It was hard not being able to see her for a long while, but visits are back on, and I am able to spend time each day with my best friend.

Kenneth Carder expresses my feelings well. In his book <u>Ministry with the Forgotten</u> he writes: Upon learning of Linda's (Kenneth Carder's wife) diagnosis, a friend asked, 'Ken, I have put Linda on my daily prayer list. How shall I pray for her and you?' That's my persistent question as Linda goes through the stages of her dementia. My frequent prayer is, "God, I don't know how to pray. I want Linda healed of her confusion; but if that isn't possible, I want the best for her. I just don't know what it is!

And there is comfort in this. When I do not know what or how to pray, God does, and He prays for me. Likewise, the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. "For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered." (Romans 8: 26)

For those ministering to a loved one, or member of their congregation living with dementia, I must heartily recommend Kenneth Carder's book, <u>Ministry with the Forgotten</u> (2019, Abingdon Press.) It is a book with a lot of heart and a lot of wisdom.

God has given great grace and strength through this journey, and I know it will continue. Thanks be to Him.


