2. Connecting with our new President Darren Herbold

July 7, 2022, Rev. Darren Herbold was elected by General Assembly in Sherwood Park, AB, commencing August 1, 2022.

Darren experienced success in the online and retail business world before becoming a pastor and, along with his wife Naomi, an international worker with The Alliance Canada. He was in business for six years prior to ministering at Beulah Alliance Church in Edmonton for seven years, where he served as the Senior

In 2014, Darren and Naomi went to serve as international workers in Thailand, where Darren also launched a Thai foundation focused on anti-trafficking and evangelistic efforts in Thailand. While there, Darren and Naomi became the Regional Developers for part of Southeast Asia and Latin America for The Alliance Canada, and Darren was one of the key initiators in the Gateway project. Darren has also served as the international worker representative on The Alliance Canada Board of Directors

Darren graduated from Covenant Bible College in Strathmore, AB (Certificate in Christian Studies), Taylor University College in Edmonton, AB (B.A. in Religion and Theology), and Liberty University in the USA (M.A. [with high distinction] in Global Studies). Darren and Naomi have three children and have relocated to southern Ontario.

Their son Judah faces the challenges of grade 11 in a new school and 12-year-old Esther needs discernment as a bold evangelist.

His best sermon is "The Hope of God". Christian hope is realistic...here is not home.

At the ECD Regional meeting he gave Reflections on Choosing a Better Way, using the example of the Samaritan woman.

Deeply caring about all people.
 Are you willing to pray, "Jesus help me to love better—to love people like you

love people?"

2. Seeing like Jesus sees.

Are you willing to be inconvenienced and interrupted for God?

3. Embrace the uncomfortable.

Is there anything keeping me from the cause of Christ?

We were challenged to take a posture of listening:

- 1. What is right in your world that Jesus wants to partner with you to optimize?
- 2. What is broken in your world that Jesus wants to partner with you to fix?
- 3. What is confused in your world that Jesus wants to speak divine clarity into?
- 4. What is missing in our world that Jesus wants you to create?

Darren assured us that he still endorses the Vision Prayer:

"O God, with all our hearts, we long for you. Come transform us to be Christ-centered, Spirit-empowered, mission-focused people, multiplying disciples everywhere."


He has no intention of changing our statement of faith, realizing that there may be some difficult conversations with those of differing views.



I bless you with the knowledge that I'm the same God that brought the Israelites out of Egypt and I am still walking with you!


I bless you with life and light, with the flow of fresh water that brings life. With Me is the fountain of life; by My light, you see light.

I risked by saying: "That is wonderful but I feel differently, because if people cannot take the time to visit with me when I am living, I do not want them to come and view my dead body."

The second situation is concerning a dear friend of mine and former Ambrose University Board Member (Joe Schuringa) who has just turned 90. He organized a great celebration and invited many people to come and celebrate as he has now entered his 10th decade of life. I did hear some push back that such could be an ego thing. He expressed to all present: "I wanted to invite people who have had an impact on my life and I thank you for the contribution you made to make me the person I am today."

This lay person, Joe Schuringa, was very influential in assisting in the move of Ambrose to Calgary, and raising money for the construction of the campus. Former Ambrose president, George Durance spoke at Joe's 90th birthday celebration, October 2nd.
