In March (a month before their wedding), Herman travelled to Hong Kong Alliance Seminary and taught a course to over 125

young seminarians, while Susanna travelled to Prague to train Chinese leaders there. On the way back from Hong Kong, Herman joined Susanna in Prague and they both taught together. At the retirement celebration, Wayne Kerr mentioned this teaming together in Prague and that they really

Susanna is the first female Lead Pastor to be ordained in the Canadian Alliance and also is the longest serving female Lead Pastor having served 26 years. Pastor Wendell K. Grout

8 MAY, 1930 - 25 JANUARY, 2024

On the evening of January 25, 2024, Wendell K. Grout passed from this life into eternity at the age of 93.

Wendell met and fell in love with Leila Mae Brezina while in high school. The two were married in Esbon, KS, August 26th, 1949, (the church where Wendell became a Christian just a couple of years earlier). They raised five children together, one daughter and four sons.

For most of his ministry career Wendell was simply known as Pastor Grout. He pastored and led several churches in nearly 50 years of professional ministry. Most notably pastoring for nineteen years at Blue Ridge Bible Church in Kansas City, MO, five years at Lake Harriet Baptist Church in Minneapolis, MN, and 20 years at First Alliance Church in Calgary, Alberta. After retiring from full time ministry, he continued to serve local churches by providing pulpit supply and as an interim pastor.



Pastor Grout loved to preach. He believed firmly in his calling to preach "the whole counsel of God", demonstrating this conviction by preaching through the entire Bible many times over the years, unlocking for his congregations the major themes and messages from each of the 66 books of the Bible.

In the 1970s he had a radio Bible program every week on KTIS in Minneapolis. He was highly sought after as an evangelist and conference speaker allowing him to travel extensively throughout the US and Canada, preaching wherever he was welcomed. He spoke regularly at camp meetings, colleges, and youth conferences like the LIFE Conference of the Christian and Missionary Alliance. Ministries like Village Missions, Stonecroft Ministries, Ecola Bible School, and Horn Creek Conference Center, would invite him back year after year. His speaking invitations also took him around the world. He visited many countries on the continents of Europe, Asia, Africa and South America, encouraging missionaries and speaking to national churches. He also led several tours of The Holy Land. His wife Leila, not being quite as adventurous, only occasionally accompanied him on those trips, but she did, however, always travel with him when he was invited to speak at Peoples Church in Spanish Wells, Bahamas. Almost by accident Pastor Grout curated a photograph collection from exotic and historic locations around the world. Those photos adorned the walls of his church offices and his home office.

Vital to Pastor Grout's love for preaching was his love for reading and studying. His library grew year after year and by the time he retired filled almost every space of the lower level of his home. As an author he contributed three books to that library. Two of them were self-published collections of letters to his congregations, and the third was a commentary on the New Testament books of Colossians and Philemon, which was published as part of The Deeper Life Pulpit Commentary from Christian Publications.

In 2016 he donated his entire library to Denver Seminary for the edification of budding preachers and theologians. In his retirement years he created and regularly posted on his own blog called Today's

Truth. He also created a digital resource called "A Walk Through The Word", highlighting an overview and major themes from every book of the Bible.

Pastor Grout was also a wise and visionary leader. He served on several higher education and professional boards and committees. He served as interim president of Calvary Bible College in the early 1970s. He was on the boards of Calvary Bible College (now Calvary University), Canadian Bible College (now Ambrose University) and Prairie Bible Institute (now Prairie College). He served for many years on the Licensing and Ordination Council of the Western Canadian District of the Christian and Missionary Alliance. He was the driving force behind the establishment of two Christian schools; Blue Ridge Christian School in Kansas City, MO, opened in 1968, and Glenmore Christian Academy in Calgary, Alberta, established in 1980. Both schools continue to be thriving alternatives to public education today. In the 1980s Pastor Grout also cast vision for an Assisted Living home in Calgary known as Glenmore Manor. Many seniors and their families still benefit from this affordable housing community today.

Friends and family who knew Pastor Grout well, remember him as a committed follower of Jesus, faithful, loyal, honest, always positive, outgoing, gregarious, and generous with his resources, both financial and relational.

Pastor Grout made known his desire for anyone wishing to honor his memory to consider giving to the Global Advance Fund of the Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada, or the Great Commission Fund of the Christian and Missionary Alliance in the U.S.

"Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away."

Don Dirks shares the results of being used by God decades ago, and now being reminded of the fruit of he and Elma's willingness to meet a need at the time, not realizing the eternal results then.

Dick writes: "I received my copy of 'Caleb & Co' the USA quarterly newsletter for retired pastors, missionaries, and Christian workers. One article really caught my attention. It exposes what God has done but I want to add the story of my acquaintance with Richard and Lillian Phillips and share what a blessing they were to our French Alliance national Church."

I know that we will have many Canadian readers and former missionaries that will be thrilled.



In 1975 when the Communists took over Vietnam, I was in the process of translating the New Testament into the language of the Mnong, a tribe in hills of central Vietnam. Only a few portions of the Scriptures were in print. North Vietnamese troops captured Lillian and me and confiscated our satchel full of typewritten manuscripts. Everything seemed lost. We were set free after about eight months and reassigned to a West African country.

Years later, we were dumbfounded to receive a copy of the Mnong Scriptures—and not just the New Testament, but the whole Bible. How could that ever have happened? A team of Mnong men, including

some that I had trained, had continued translating in secret. Despite severe government restrictions on the church, the believers had managed to complete the work and print it. Although it needed some corrections, a revision was done by the Bible Society, and the Mnong Bible was dedicated on August 19, 2023. What a joy!

And what about the Mnong church? Believers in that tribe numbered about 6,000 in 1975 when all missionaries had to leave. The latest figure I heard is 102,741, not counting those who have emigrated. Praise the Lord!

This is how Elma and I got involved with the Phillips.

When the Phillips were reassigned to West Africa as mentioned in the article above, Richard wrote to me. I was the Board Representative of the C&MA in France and was pastoring the Boulogne French Church in the suburb of Paris.



Richard is a PHD linguist and knew what he wanted.

He wrote asking me to find a "home" for them for 3 months preferably in the suburbs of Paris. They had no intention of attending a language training school but wanted to be totally immersed in a French community ie. town or village. In a sequence of events that only God could have arranged, I was able to find them a French engineer's home, of a Christian family. The owner of that home was going to California with his whole family, for a training program and wanted the Philips to live in their

home. Their home was situated in the very beautiful Orsay Valley to the south of Paris. Even the dates and the costs matched what our Mission needs were.

So the Philips came to Paris

We would see them once a week when they came to pick up their mail. On Sundays they discreetly attended morning worship in the church that I pastored but they would slip away quickly after the services. Often Elma and I would arrange to do a meal together with these dear friends when they came for their mail...

Their three months passed all too quickly so I organized a special Missions weekend and invited Richard to speak at their final service on Sunday morning. When I introduced him, I shared with the congregation that he was a professional linguist and they had only been in Paris for three months to learn French. The older members of the congregation looked at each other with obvious unbelief. I had arranged for a young bi-lingual student attending the nearby Evangelical Seminary to interpret Richard's testimony.

Then came a surprise. Richard came to the pulpit with poise and ease and said in perfect French: "My dear friends, before I call on my Interpreter, I want to express our gratitude and thanks for the kind friendship that you have shown us during these last three months...." From memory he spoke for several minutes. Elma and I were so proud to be associated with them in ministry.

The testimony that he shared and their intrepid faith to still continue their missionary life was very compelling.

After they were gone several of the older members of my church came to tell me: "We have heard many times about the remarkable work that Alliance missionaries are doing all over the world, but now we have our own missionaries." What a boost to our growing denomination in France and to the credibility of our work. The reputation of this incredible couple became our credentials.
